Etheldreda, Princess, Abbess, Saint

Etheldreda's World - Princess, Abbess, Saint . Thought for the week

This is what St. Paul wrote: "Now if Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Cor. 15, 12). In this passage, St. Paul argues for the resurrection of the dead from the resurrection of Christ, because we could not rise from the dead if Christ had not won the power to raise from the dead those who participate in His own human nature, being with Christ one body and hence having the same life.
