

Priest Training Fund

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and there will be a retiring collection to support the Priest Training Fund (Diocese of Westminster). This fund pays for the priestly formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 50 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 13 of whom are from the Diocese of Wesminster. 2 of these are deacons for Westminster. There are also 2 seminarians at the Royal English College in Valladolid. Last year 3 deacons who studied at Allen Hall were ordained priests. Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost has been elected Pope Leo XIV as the 267th Bishop of Rome. "Peace be with all of you!" – the first words of Pope Leo XIV. He is the first Augustinian Pope and the second Roman Pontiff from the Americas after Pope Francis. However, unlike Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the 69-year-old Robert Francis Prevost is from the northern part of the American continent, though he spent many years as a missionary in Peru before being elected head of the Augustinians for two consecutive terms. Let us pray for our new Holy Father.

Etheldreda, Princess, Abbess, Saint

Etheldreda's World - Princess, Abbess, Saint . If the church accepts your request you will be invited to a preliminary meeting where the initial paperwork will be completed and the whole procedure will be explained and set in motion.
